This course is by permit only. It is mandatory that the student, before attending this class, have a focused topic responsive to an upcoming Request for Proposals deadline, and a faculty advisor willing to support/assist this effort.

The participant's faculty advisor must be willing to:

- Assist the student in developing a project based on testable hypotheses;
- Provide feedback at various points in the proposal-writing process to help the student develop a strong proposal, and;
- Attend and play a role in the final panel reviews that are part of the course.
